Liberty Tire’s Baytown facility recently added a new rubber mulch production line to the facility’s operations. The plant anticipates that it will color and bag more than 35 million pounds of rubber mulch in 2011. The colored mulch will be sold as Pinnacle Rubber Mulch, introduced to the marketplace last year by LTR Products, a subsidiary of Liberty Tire Recycling. Pinnacle Rubber Mulch is an innovative alternative to traditional wood mulch for landscaping and playground surfacing that soon will be available at major retailers such as Wal-Mart and Home Depot as well as local bulk yards.
